



Pharmacovigilance Summary Report: July-September 2018


The Pharmacy and Poisons Board is the Drug Regulatory Authority established under the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, Chapter 244 of the Laws of Kenya. The Board regulates the Practice of Pharmacy and the manufacture and trade in drugs and poisons.

PPB has 6 directorates of which the Directorate of Medicines Information and Pharmacovigilance (MIPV) is responsible for Pharmacovigilance, Post-Market Surveillance, Clinical Trials & Medicines Information activities. MIPV shares quarterly pharmacovigilance reports with stakeholders to serve as a feedback mechanism and also encourage all stakeholders to report.


Since the introduction of PV in Kenya, a total of 11,653 individual case safety reports have been submitted to the global database 18,461,044 (0.06%). This quarter one of 2018/2019, number of reports received went down (93 reports) compared to previous quarter which submitted (141 reports).




Most ADRs reported consistently by pharmacist throughout the quarter, followed by other professionals then physician.



Majority of the patients that are affected by ADR are adults throughout the quarter.





In quarter 1 of 2018, 23 (25%) serious ADR reports were reported.




Of these, 9 cases required hospitalization. 2 deaths were reported due to suspected ADR and 3 cases were disabling to the patient.










ARVs 34(38%) accounted for most of the suspected Female (56%) mostly affected by ADRs compared to

System organ mostly affected by ADRs is the general disorders and site administration disorders followed by skin and subcutaneous tissue, gastrointestinal disorders system, nervous system disorders and infection and infestations in that order.



Most ADRs either recovered or were recovering 79 (68%). Outcome of 26 (22%) ADRs were unknown.

Most reported ADR terms were either rash, gynaecomastia, anaemia, diarrhea and maternal exposure before pregnancy.

All the reports in quarter were submitted by just 37 health facilities in the country. 13 reports had no facility indicated on them. To put this in context, there are over 9,000 health facilities listed in the Kenya Master Facility List (MFL). Top reporting facility in the country is this quarter 1 of 2018 was Machakos level 5 hospital (11).

sADR reports were received from 23 of the 47 counties. Nairobi County submitted the most ADRS reports (15) followed by Machakos (13) then Kiambu (7).
